## **FLEMINGTON JUMPOUTS**

Heat 1 – 800m

KRAKRIB – Gelded this prep, always jumps out well and did so again here at Flemington. He did so without too much pressure and switched off late. How he parades is the key to him getting back in the winner's circle, he can run his race in the preliminary where he gets anxious and up on the toe so worth monitoring. Physically still on the small side so 1000m may be his limit.

Heat 2 - 800m

MARBLE ARCH – Progressive mare with Team Hayes, put three on end to start her career and has come back nicely putting two good efforts together, quiet jumpout from the back at Bendigo and let down out wide on the circle when asked for an effort in this heat. Nominated for a BM84 on Saturday and jumpouts suggest she'll be competitive.

Heat 3 – ELOYOU & SHESALLSHENANIGANS – The latter had one of the better 2YO preparations winning three races two of those restricted and did everything right on the speed to do so. Similarly in this jumpout rolling forward she dropped her head into a good rhythm and held it to the line. Too early to say she's improved on last season and look forward to her second for a better guide. ELOYOU hasn't made it to the races as yet but has talent judging by his jumpouts when last in work and finished the best behind the winner.

Heat 4 - 800m

MAKTOOB – Led up by the speedy ADITI who won the jumpout in good time, this import was ridden quiet and differently to his work leading into last campaign where he won 2/3 starts upon arriving in Australia. Often we see these internationals improve at their second Australian campaign, he's likely to have another jumpout where we may see more from him ahead of his resumption.

Heat 8 - 800m

FLYCATCHER – Freshened after his narrow but impressive debut win swooping wide at Bendigo, he returned for a tick-over jumpout ahead of his next assignment and was given an easy time of things, on the bridle and is a horse who can win again on what he's shown to date, may even get out to 1400m and further.
