Heat 1 - (1000m)

We saw Melbourne Cup winner GOLD TRIP make a return for his first jumpout after a Sydney Autumn campaign. A lacklustre effort out the back and didn't make an impression in the straight but also didn't show a lot of intent either, will be watching his second jumpout or trial for a better guide on his progress. NORMANDY BRDGE jumped out well in third, he enjoyed the soft conditions and has race-fitness on his side, slightly disappointing last start, if he can find similar footing in coming weeks expect him to bounce back.

## Heat 2 - (800m)

**DENY KNOWLEDGE** – Geelong Country Oaks winner before going to the paddock and loved how she's come back in this heat, finishing at the rear, she was given a soft time of things by Mick Kent which is no surprise in her first one back. A middle-distance mare who could go to another level this campaign and look for more from her in her second jumpout. CARLISLE was the eye-catcher of the heat, flashing late in second and after three jumpouts is set to resume at Flemington, Saturday.

## Heat 6 - (800m)

PAPILLON CLUB went out a winner of the Group 3 Alexandra Stakes over 1600m in the Autumn and had a quiet jumpout for her return this preparation, the Greg Eurell-trained mare thrived last time after nursing a few niggles early in her career. Forward in the run and held together to the line with a number of runners crossing the line together, expect to see more from Papillon Club at her next one.

## Heat 8 - (800m)

ETERNAL FLAME has been an impressive trialist this campaign, three in total and worked home stylishly from the back of the field to finish third in this heat. She brings strong formlines from last campaign and looks set to run well fresh and as a lightly-raced 4YO mare she should continue to progress.

# **BENDIGO JUMPOUTS 01/08**

Heat 6 - (800m)

EL PODER DEL SOL – Full brother to VIRTUOUS CIRCLE carried a spruik for his 2YO debut at Flemington over 1400m in May and did not disappoint despite being beaten, held up and rattled home in fourth then tipped out. Liam Howley trains and he's a classic Derby-looking colt by Almanzor and was super in this jumpout travelling on a tight rein for most of it, he won narrowly with ease and punters should be eyeing him off in the futures markets judging by the way he's come back.

#### Heat 7 - (800m)

MAD MAX – Smart-looking son of Savabeel with Andrew Forsman, the 3YO was very impressive leading throughout and winning softly, has early speed and a great action, he too is one to blackbook for races such as the Caulfield Guineas.
